

WHO FIRST LIVED IN BRITAIN?

Welcome back to the Spring Term and a Happy New Year to you all! We have a busy term ahead of us, so please make sure you add our key dates to your diary. English

In English for the first half—term we will be reading the text 'The Boy with the Bronze Axe' by Kathleen Fidler. This classic story is set in the ancient Stone Age village of Skara Brae on Orkney. This is a fascinating and vividly portrayed story of life nearly 3,000 years ago. The will read and explore the text whilst experimenting with a variety of different fiction and non-fiction writing styles.

Maths

In Maths we will be continuing to cover a variety of topics including Fractions, Division using Fractions, Measures, Multiplication and Division. We ask that you continue to support your child in learning their times tables. In Year 3 the children need to know the 3, 4 and 8 x tables. History

In History we will be addressing the question 'Who first lived in Britain?'. We will investigate with a range of activities and an educational visit to Creswell Crags will help answer this question further. Alongside our class text we will start to uncover how the first people in Britain lived and how they progressed over time.
